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*As drought looms in Longido, herders urged to sell cattle in good time

LONGIDO District Commissioner, Frank Mwaisumbe has advised herders in the district to better sell their livestock during this period while they are still healthy before they are being hit by the severe impacts of drought.

According to Mwaisumbe, due to low vuli rains this year, most of the district has been hit by drought thus affecting water and feeds of the animals.

"It is better for the farmers to

take decision now before the animals become skinny or die due to lack of enough food, we have witnessed difficult situation for livestock keepers here due to drought brought by insufficient vuli rains, to avoid more effects, let us them sell the animals while they are healthy," the DC advised the herders.

In an interview with this paper, Mwaisumbe said that animals like cattle, sheep and goats need enough feed to survive and stay healthy, so contrary to that the

animals may die.

"There are some herders who have already taken their animals to the areas with enough water and feeds, but those who are yet to do so, I advise them to sell the animals now, the livestock can be sold to the meat processing factory located at Namanga border area," he added.

He also urged the pastoralists who will sell the animals to make proper use of the monies by purchasing calves and goats once the masika rain season begins so

as to sustain their business.

The official also warned some herders who have been moving their animals from Longido to Emboseri area in Kenya and West Kilimanjaro to avoid selling the animals in the neighboring country without obtaining permit from the government because doing so is against the country's laws.

There are some pastoralists who take advantage of the drought situation to sell the animals in the neighboring Kenya to avoid

tax and levies, this is not allowed and once we catch them, stern measures will be taken," he said.

Steven Kiruswa, Longido legislator said that he has started to mobilize resources, encourage pastoralists to form groups and sell the livestock at a fair price.

"Majority of the pastoralists have been falling into the wrong hands of agents when it comes to selling their animals, this is why they are campaigning and educating them to avoid these dealers but rather form groups

to sell the animals in a profitable way," he said.

He said that selling the animals will also improve their income and food security in their households.

"We are organizing a mega conference which will bring all pastoralists in Longido to discuss among other things commercial and sustainable livestock keeping, during the conference, a number of challenges facing the group will be addressed including how to fight the impacts brought by drought," Kiruswa said.

Fish market value increases by 17pc

THE value of fish sold in registered markets rose by 16.8 per cent to 84.8bn/- in the quarter ending September last year from 72.6bn/- of the corresponding quarter in 2019 on account of the measures taken by the government to control illegal fishing.

According to the Bank of Tanzania (BoT)'s consolidated zonal economic performance report the increase in the value was recorded in all zones except Dar es Salaam and Central, partly underpinned by an improvement in the quantity of fish sold in the markets by 8.6 per cent to 10,784.3 tonnes.

Meanwhile, a decline in the value of fish sold in Central and Dar es Salaam zones was due to a decrease in fish imports and local catches.

To reap maximum benefits from fishing, the government recently announced plans to strengthen a crackdown on illegal fishing with stern legal measures taken against the culprits.

Deputy Minister for Livestock and Fisheries Pauline Gekul said previous anti-illegal fishing activities forced the government to spend about 1.2bn/- on crackdowns, something that should not be repeated.

She said the government had put in place plans to purchase four new fishing vessels in the Indian Ocean to boost fishing ac-

tivities and address illegal fishing in the country.

The vessels, according to the deputy minister, will help create 45,000 employment opportunities for Tanzanians.

Councils were directed to set aside 15 per cent of their revenues accrued from livestock and fishing sector for supporting development projects in their areas, including providing loans to fishermen.

According to the CCM 2020-2025 manifesto, the government focuses on improving ports and purchasing modern fishing vessels to improve the economy through fishing activities.

The ruling party's manifesto states that major fisheries development will be on course once the fishing environment is improved to attract both small and big investors to engage in the business.

The government aims at building a big fishing port along the Coast that will attract big fishing vessels for deep sea vessels to dock.

It also looks forward to providing fishing education to local fishermen, especially on the use of proper equipment and best fishing methods.

"The purchase of new five vessels will go along with the establishment of new fish processing industries and strengthening of existing ones.

This will help create a reliable market for fish products and boost the sector," reads part of the document.

Zim to unlock insurance against extreme weather risk

GERMANY'S state development bank KfW and the World Food Programme (WFP) have committed to contribute \$2 million each, to African Risk Capacity Insurance Company Limited (ARC) to support premium financing of insurance against risks caused by extreme weather events in Zimbabwe, Treasury has said.

Zimbabwe will contribute \$500,000 and this will unlock maximum insurance cover of \$20 million. The ARC provides capacity building on preparedness for climatic shocks, as well as insurance against risks such as droughts.

Following the government's participation in the ARC drought risk insurance policy, complemented by the United Nations WFP "Replies Policy" for the 2019/20 agricultural season, Zimbabwe received a total pay-out of \$1.75 million in June last year.

The pay-out assisted a substantial number of the country's vulnerable households in selected districts, through the disbursement of unconditional cash transfers to food insecure and labour-constrained households (chronically ill, older person headed households) in the worst drought-affected wards.

According to the Treasury, 77,767 households are from Chivhu, Binga, Bulilima, Bubera and Uzumba.

"Zimbabwe is committed to participating in the 2020/21 ARC programme," said the Treasury.

"To relieve fiscal challenges that member states face in paying their premiums compounded by the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, ARC has facilitated application of premium subsidy from KfW German Government towards minimum funding for the 2020/21 agricultural season."


