SERIKALI imesema mradi wa machinjio ya kisasa wa Ranchi ya Nguru Hills, wilayani Mvomero mkoani Morogoro, umetafsiri dhamira ya serikali ya awamu ya sita inayoongozwa na Rais Dk. Samia Suluhu Hassan, kupambana na umaskini kutokana na kutoa ajira kwa wataanzania.

Waziri wa Mifugo na Uvuvi, Mashimba Ndaki, aliyasema hayo mwishoni mwa wiki wakati akizindua kiwanda hicho kilichopo wilayani Mvomero.

"Sakta za mifugo na kilimo ni kubwa nchini, wataanzania walio wengi wamejiajiri, hivyo inapotokea uwekezaji katika eneo hilo, tafsiri yake ni kwenda kuwainua wafugaji na wakulima ambao ndio kundi kubwa," alisema.

Waziri huyo aliagiza ajira ambazo zinaweza kufanywa na wataanzania, wapewe fursa hiyo na si kila kazi kufanywa na wageni.

Alisema mradi huo wa machinjio ya kisasa, utawasaidia wafugaji kupata soko la uhakika wa mifugo yao, wakulima kuuza bidhaa mbalimbali na kunenepesha ng'ombe kabla ya kuchinjwa.

Ndaki alisema pato la serikali, pia litaongezeka kupitia kodi mbalimbali na kuleta fedha za kigeni kutokana na mauzo ya nyama katika soko la nje.

Alieleza wananchi wanaoishi kuzunguka kiwanda hicho, watanufaika na fursa mbalimbali zinazotokana na uwepo wa mradi huo.

Akifafanua zaidi, Ndaki alisema biashara ya nyama katika soko la nje, linaendelea kukua kwa kasi kwani mwaka 2020/2021, Tanzania iliua tani 1,774 katika masoko mbalimbali ya kimataifa, huku 2021/2022 tani 10,413 ziliuzwa.

Kuanzia Julai hadi mwezi uliopita, Tanzania ilisafirisha tani 4,374 za nyama zenye thamani ya dola za Marekeni 16,760,284, katika masoko ya nje.

Aliwataka wafugaji kubadilika kwa kunenepesha mifugo kutokana na mazingira yanayowekwa na serikali.

Waziri alibainisha mazingira hayo ni kuwepo viwanda ambapo wizara, imeanza mpango wa mabadiliko ya sekta ya mifugo kwa nia ya kuwa na mifugo itakayowezesha kupata malighafi.

MKURUGENZI MKUU PSSSF

Mkurugenzi Mkuu wa Mfuko wa Hifadhi ya Jamii kwa Watumishi wa Umma (PSSSF), CPA Hosea Kashimba, alisema mradi wa machinjio, umegharimu dola za Marekeni milioni 15 kwa ununuzi wa mashine na mitambo.

Pia, ukarabati wa jengo la kiwanda, ujenzi wa mabwawa ya kutibu majitaka, ujenzi wa barabara ya kuingia kiwandani na gharama za uendeshaji.

Kashimba alisema uwekezaji wa wanahisa wengine ni dola milioni 10, huku dola milioni tano ikiwa ni mkopo kutoka Benki ya Azania. PSSSF imewekeza dola milioni 3.9, kati ya dola milioni 10. Uwekezaji huo, unafanya PSSF, kuwa na asilimia 39 ya hisa.

Wawekezaji wengine wabia ni Kampuni ya Eclipse Investment LLC ya Oman yenye hisa 46 na Kampuni ya Busara Investment LLP yenye hisa asilimia 15.

Alisema mradi huo unatarajiwa kuleta manufaa mbalimbali kwa jamii ikiwemo ajira za moja kwa moja 350 na zingine za ziada 2,000, zinazotokana na mnyororo wa thamani.

Pia, Kashimba alisema mradi unalenga masoko ya ndani na nje ya nchi, hivyo ni matarajio asilimia 80 ya soko, itakuwa nje ya nchi na asilimia 20 kwa soko la ndani.

RC MWASA

Mkuu wa Mkoa wa Morogoro, Fatma Mwasa, alisema wamejiwekea mkakati wa kuanzisha ranchi sita za unenepesha ng'ombe kutoka kilogramu 120 hadi kufikia kilogramu 250 kwa mahitaji ya kiwanda cha nyama cha Nguru Hills.

Vijana wajivunia kuvuna samaki 3,000

VIKUNDI vya vijana vya CHAPAKAZI na CATFISH vinavyojishughulisha na ufugaji wa samaki kwa vizimba vimeanza kunufaika na mradi huo kwa kuvuna 3,000.

Kauli hiyo ilitolewa jana na Ofisa Vijana wa Halmashauri ya Manispaa ya Ilemela, Lucy Nicholas, wakati wa uvunaji samaki awamu ya kwanza ya mradi wa vikundi hivyo.

Vikundi hivyo vilivyokopeshwa na halmashauri hiyo sh. milioni 91.88 za mapato ya ndani, Aprili, mwaka huu.

"Tunashuhudia matunda ya vikundi viwili vya vijana vya CHAPAKAZI na CATFISH wanaojihusisha na uvuvi hapa Igalagala, baada ya miezi sita wakihangaika kwa ufugaji wa samaki kwa vizimba, hatimaye leo

(jana) wameanza kuvuna walichokipanda," alisema.

Kwa upande wake, Mwenyekiti wa Kikundi cha CATFISH, Baraka Buhegu, alieleza mradi wao ni utekelezaji wa ilani ya uchaguzi ya Chama Cha Mapinduzi ya 2020-2025 kutokana na serikali kuimarisha sekta ya uvuvi, kuongeza matumizi ya teknolojia ya uvuvi endelevu katika kupambana na kuepuka uvuvi haramu.

Aliongeza kuwezesha sekta ya uvuvi kuchangia zaidi ukuaji uchumi wa taifa, kuzalisha ajira kwa vijana na kuboresha maisha ya wavuvi na wananchi kwa ujumla.

Baraka aliishukuru Halmashauri ya Manispaa ya Ilemela kwa kuwaamini na kuwapatia fedha zilizowawezesha kufuga samaki kwa vizimba, ambao ni wa kisasa, hivyo kuwasaidia kujikwamua na umaskini

wa kipato.

Aliipongeza serikali kwa kuweka mazingira wezeshi ya upatikanaji wa zana bora za uvuvi, kuzuia uzalishaji na uagizaji wa zana haramu za uvuvi, kuhamasisha uwekezaji wa kuzalisha vyakula vya samaki, kuwawezesha vijana mitaji na kumudu kujiajiri.

"Leo (jana) tumevuna samaki 3,000 tunaotarajia kuwauza shilingi 5,000 kwa kila mmoja, matarajio yetu kupata shilingi milioni 15 na baadhi ya wateja tunao," alisema Baraka.

Alisisitiza samaki waliowavuna ni wa viwango na wana ubora wenye radha halisi.

Ofisa Uvuvi wa Manispaa ya Ilemela, Ivon Maha, alisema mradi huo ulibuniwa na vijana wenyewe na kuungwa mkono na wataalamu wa uvuvi hadi kuvuna samaki.

Wavuvi 'waiangukia' serikali waongezewe muda

BAADHI ya wavuvi na wamiliki wa mitumbwi wanaofanya shughuli zao katika Ziwa Victoria, wameiomba serikali kuwaongezea muda ili kuachana na matumizi ya taa za betri kwa ajili ya shughuli za uvuvi wa dagaa.

Wavuvi hao wanatakiwa kutumia taa za mwanga wa jua (solar), badala ya taa zinazotumia betri katika shughuli zao za uvuvi.

Walisema ikiwa wataacha kutumia betri hizo kwa sasa bila kujiandaa watapata hasara kutokana na kutumia

fedha nyingi kuzinunua.

Pia agizo hilo limekuja ghafla kutokana na baadhi ya wavuvi kufanya uwekezaji katika taa hizo na kusitisha matumizi yake kunaweza kuwasababishia hasara.

"Tunaomba kuongezewa muda hata kufikia mwezi wa sita mwakani ili na sisi tuweze kujiandaa kwani hata hivyo utafiti wa kubaini madhara yake bado haujafanyika kikaamilifu maana hatujaambiwa ukali wa mwanga wa taa tunazozitumia kwa sasa na zile wanazotaka tutumie," alisema Mandondo Maro, mmiliki wa mtumbwi.

Edward Manna, mvuvi wa dagaa akizungumzia hatua hiyo alisema alikuwa amechukua mikopo na kuwekeza katika taa hizo.

Alisema alikuwa hajui kama taa hizo ni haramu na kuzisitisha ghafla kutamsababishia aingie kwenye madeni ambayo uwezo wa kulipa ni mdogo.

Akitoa ufafanuzi kuhusu marufuku hiyo, Kaimu Ofisa Mfawidhi ulinzi na usimamizi na rasilimali za wavuvi Kanda ya Ziwa, Laurent Mbujiro, alisema matumizi ya taa hizo ni ukiukwaji wa kifungu namba 16 kifungu kidogo (ii) cha

sheria za uvuvi.

Novemba 17, Waziri wa Mifugo na Uvuvi, Mashimba Ndaki, akiwa mkoani Mwanza, alitoa muda wa miezi miwili kwa wavuvi wanaotumia taa za umeme wa jua zinazotumia betri kuacha kwa kuwa zinadaiwa kuwa kichocheo cha uvuvi haramu na kuharibu mazalia ya samaki katika Ziwa Victoria kutokana na kuwa na mwanga mkali.

Aidha, aliwataka wavuvi wa dagaa kutumia taa zenye mfumo wa umeme jua moja kwa moja badala ya zinazounganishwa na betri kutokana na kubainika kuwa na madhara.

Nyavu za timba zinafunga kizazi cha samaki

Mpwapwa. Kutokana na athari za kutumia kemikali zinazoathiri mazalia ya samaki, Serikali imekemea uvuvi haramu ili kuzifanya rasili-mali hizo kuwa endelevu.

Onyo hilo limetolewa na Waziri wa Nchi Ofisi ya Waziri Mkuu, Sera, Bunge na Uratibu, George Simbachawene alipozungumza na wananchi wa Kata ya Mtera iliyopo katika Jimbo la Kibakwe wilayani Mpwapwa, kusikiliza na kutatua kero zao.

"Msitumie nyavu za timba ambazo zina sumu zinazoua mazalia ya samaki na kusababisha madhara hata kwa mtumiaji wa samaki waliovu-liwa kwa nyavu hizo," amesema Simbachawene.

Matumizi ya nyavu hizo amesema yana-sababisha bwawa hilo kutokuwa endelevu kwani hakuna uvuvi unaoendelea kutokana na kukosekana kwa samaki.

"Ofisa uvuvi wa Halmashauri ya Wilaya ya Mpwapwa kwa kushiriki-ana na maofisa uvuvi katika maeneo yanayozunguka Bwawa la Mtera andae-ni andiko litakalosaidea kuja na mkakati wa uvuvi endelevu katika Bwawa la Mtera," amesema Waziri Simbachawene.

Naye Ofisa Uvuvi wa Halmashauri ya Wilaya ya Mpwapwa, Francisco Mwanga amesema matu-mizi ya nyavu haramu aina ya timba ni hatari kwani zinapowagusa samaki huwafanya wash-indwe kuzaliana.

"Elimu imetolewa kwa wavuvi na waka-ti mwingine wanapigwa faini lakini bado wanaendelea na uvuvi haramu uliosababisha samaki kutozalana," amesema Mwanga.

Akizungumza kwenye mkutano huo, Hussein Mkwizu alisema utoaji wa elimu kuhusu uvuvi haramu ni suala linalopaswa kuwa ajenda ya kudumu kwenye vikao vya maendeleo vya kijiji ili kujenga uelewa wa pamoja kwa wavuvi na wananchi kwa ujumla, kwani wao ni walaji wa samaki wanaopatikana.

"Hakuna kambi inayolizunguka Bwawa la Mtera ambayo haijapitia shida hii, sasa hivi kila mtu anafikiria namna tatizo hili linavyoweza kutatuliwa na lisijirudie," alisema.

Uvuvi haramu unapigwa vita nchini ili kuzifanya rasilimali za majini kuwa endelevu, kwani matumizi ya kemikali au nyavu zenye matundu madogo hupunguza kama si kuondoa kabisa samaki wadogo wanaotakiwa kukua kabla ya kuvuliwa kwa ajili ya kitoweo.

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Light on the horizon for TZ fisheries sector

THE sustainability of the country's fisheries resources depends on the existence of effective plans and strategies to manage appropriate harvesting methods and the proper use of those resources.

The government on its part is implementing various plans and strategies, including the Third Five-Year National Development Plan (2021/22-2025/26), the CCM Manifesto (2020-2025) which aims to reform the fisheries sector.

The objective is to enable fisheries to be sustainable and to enhance social welfare by providing employment, income and security, food and food security as well as boosting the national economy.

Despite these good intentions and initiatives taken by the government, the fishing sector has in recent years been plagued by illegal fishing, which has been found to threaten various fish products derived from the country's fisheries resources.

In response to the challenge, Prime Minister Kassim Majaliwa recently convened a special meeting between the Ministry of Fisheries and Livestock and Regional Commissioners, Regional Administrative Secretaries, district commissioners and district/cities executive directors and councils' chairmen, regional and district security and defence committees, fisheries owners and fisheries stakeholders from lake regions with a view to discussing the challenges of illegal fishing.

In a speech read on his behalf by Minister of Livestock and Fisheries Mr Mashimba Ndaki, which was filled with a strong message to government officials, fisheries industry stakeholders and fishermen themselves, the Prime Minister said Lake Victoria's contribution is significant compared to other areas and urged stakeholders living around the lake to have a responsibility to protect, sustain and effectively manage the harvesting and sustainable use of fisheries resources on the lake.

He said despite the importance of the lake economically, some unscrupulous stakeholders have deliberately resorted to illegal methods in fishing and trading fishing products, thereby affecting the sustainability of the resource and its actual contribution to the growth of the national economy.

"It is obvious illegal fishing practices are rampant in any areas where fishing activities are carried out, especially Lake Victoria," the Prime Minister said.

uation threatened the continued existence of the resource for the coming years if fishermen do not stop using unsustainable methods in fishing.

The Prime Minister said based on those facts, all fisheries stakeholders, including ministries, government institutions and the community, have a wider responsibility to work with the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries to ensure the complete eradication of non-compliant fisheries for the sustainability of the country's resources.

Giving specific instructions, the Prime Minister urged all government institutions, local authorities, the private sector, non-governmental organizations and development partners to actively participate in the elimination of illegal fishing and trafficking practices.

"Let everyone be the protector of the other and the government will never tolerate these actions of reviving our nation's development through the fishing sector," he said.

He directed the regional and district commissioners, council directors and all executives in the country to ensure that illegal fishing practices are stopped in their areas and all those found guilty of illegal fishing should be held accountable according to the law.

"This work should be supervised by all leaders from regional to village level and the performance of these lead-

more," he stressed and urged the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries and the President's Office to continue educating the public on the protection and sustainable management of fisheries resources in the country.

The Deputy Minister of Livestock and Fisheries, Abdallah Ulega said the government in this financial year has allocated a total of 110bn/- to develop the fisheries sector and the purchasing of fishing boats and their engines.

Ulega said the money will also be used for aquaculture projects in fish cages, the construction of three beaches and seven markets, ice production plants and sardines drying nets.

"The aim is to reduce the loss of fisheries and increase its value and marketing fisheries products in the country," he said.

He said out of the allocated funds, 50bn/- will be used for the construction of a fishing port which has already started at Kilwa Masoko in Kilwa district in Lindi region.

He said despite the government's efforts, the fisheries sector provides 4.5 million jobs to Tanzanians across the value chain, including fisheries processors, traders, fishing equipment manufacturers, aquaculture keepers as well as food vendors.

He said the sector accounts for nearly 30 percent of animal-based protein and exported fishing products bring in foreign exchange earnings and the sector currently accounts for 1.8 percent of the country's GDP.

He said to enable the country to continue benefiting from fisheries resources, the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries has already put in place fisheries resource management mechanisms in the country, including the National Fisheries Policy 2015 implemented through the Fisheries Act No 22 of 2003, the Fisheries Regulations 2009 and its 2022 amendments as well as other state laws.

He urged all government officials who are proved to have accepted bribes for illegal fishing practices and illegal trade in fishing products of any kind will face strict legal action, including being fired from office.

He called on fishermen and fisheries stakeholders across the country to operate in accordance with the Fisheries Act and Regulations as well as other country's laws.

"Whoever is nabbed committing illegal fishing activities will be brought to justice on the spot as we will not tolerate such practices any-

reducing poverty and unemployment.

"Another goal is to increase productivity, food security and GDP," he said.

He said apart from these government initiatives, the Ministry has continued to face various operational challenges that have been undermining the achievement of the sustainable goal of fisheries and promoting the sector's contribution to the national economy.

The Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Livestock and Fisheries, Dr Rashid Tamamah in the fish industry, said for the year 2021, a total of 42,302.00 tonnes of fishing crops and 181,268 ornamental live fish worth 414.23bn/- were sold abroad.

"Lake Victoria accounted for 67 percent

(36,657.46 tonnes) worth 360.35bn/-," he said.

He said the government has facilitated small-scale fishermen and aquaculture keepers with 33bn/- in interest-free loans for the purchase of 160 boats and 682 fish cages which are expected to produce 60,000 tonnes.

"The government has also enabled seaweed (Mwani) farmers to increase production from 3,514 tonnes to

6,000 tonnes," he said.

The representative of the Nile perch fishermen, Mr Augustino Gimasa urged the government to use the police force to enhance the security of fishermen in the lake, control encroachments including theft of fishermen's property and equipment such as engines, nets as well as the arbitrary purchase of fish in the lake.

The Tanzania Fishermen

Association Chairperson, Mr Baraka Kadapi said effective mechanisms should be sought to end the fishing challenge, explaining that the situation is even worse with allegations that 30 percent of illegal fishing activities are carried out by people responsible from the government.

"Without being realistic and patriotic we cannot end the challenge of illegal fishing," he said.
