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Speaker says MoU on Dar port is yet to be endorsed

A FREE resolution of the National Assembly on the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the government and the United Arab Emirates for strategic port development and improvement of operations in Tanzania is yet to be endorsed, House Speaker Dr Taka Nkomo told the House here yesterday.

He said that the resolution will be tabled in the debating chamber tomorrow for legislators to express themselves on the matter, relating earlier reports that MPs had already adopted it.

The speaker said that the parliamentary resolution is currently at committee level, at which views on the MoU will be collected from stakeholders.

Thus, on June 10 the House will receive and debate the resolution on the MoU, she specified, regarding prior impressions to the contrary.

The speaker said the House fully supports the government's development initiatives, adding that parliamentary committees are all the time ready to receive and debate views brought by citizens, with a view to improving

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Bill places intelligence, security service under presidential mandate

THE National Assembly today endorsed a bill to place the Tanzania Police Force and the Tanzania Intelligence and Security Service (TISS) under presidential mandate.

The bill, which is being discussed in the National Assembly, will place the TPF and TISS under the direct control of the President, replacing the current arrangement where they are under the Prime Minister's Office.

The bill also provides for the President to appoint and dismiss the heads of the TPF and TISS, and to grant them powers of arrest and detention.

The bill is expected to be passed by the National Assembly in the coming days.

■ TPA says no deal for 100 years signed

THE Inter-Governmental Agreement (IGA) between Tanzania and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) concerning partnership on ports' developments will be brought to the National Assembly tomorrow for legislators to debate and ratify the resolution.

The IGA, concerning Economic and Social Partnership for the development and improving performance of Ports in Tanzania, was signed in February 2020, for 100 years.

The agreement signed between Tanzania Ports Authority (TPA) and DP World based in Dubai was aimed at ensuring other things, in building and improving operations of strategic infrastructure for sea and lake ports in areas such as special economic zones, large port parks and trade corridors.

Speaker of the National Assembly, Dr. Philip Mpango, informed the legislative assembly while giving clarifications over misleading information regarding the resolution reported in some media in the country.

According to Dr. Mpango, the resolution is currently at the joint committee level as per Parliament's Standing Orders, adding that after the committee has completed its work, the resolution will be brought to the House tomorrow for discussion and endorsement.

He explained that after four official requests additional attention from the government which required Parliament action, the House decided the resolution to be forwarded to the committee, which are Parliament's Committee on Infrastructure and Parliament's Committee on Ports Development. He stressed the joint committee.



The National Assembly
is ready at any time to receive debate and provide its recommendations on the issues brought to the NHU with the aim of improving the resolution of the government's plans.

Dr. Mpango said that according to the parliamentary standing orders, the joint committee was required to advise the House and receive views from various stakeholders.

"On June 7 last year the joint committee commenced public hearing on the resolution and attended a special meeting on June 8 last year," Dr. Mpango said.

He said that the Parliament would endorse it to enable stakeholders to give their views, that has been underway.
